## STRIPES \& ONE STAR PILLOW

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## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

Assorted scraps of blue, red, and white/cream/low volume (background) fabrics:

- Just 1 blue print, up to 7 red prints, and up to 7 background prints
- You'll need at a few red and background prints with at least 26 " in length for some of the long stripes.


## Additional supplies:

- $14^{\prime \prime} \times 26^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle each of batting and lightweight muslin (if you decide to quilt your pillow top)
- $12 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 24 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle of coordinating fabric for the pillow back
- Coordinating zipper, at least 18 " long (if you decide to make a zippered closure)


## CUTTING

FROM THE BLUE PRINT, CUT:

- (4) $2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares
- (1) $4 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ square

FROM THE ASSORTED RED PRINTS, CUT:

- (4) $13 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$ strips
- (3) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 26^{\prime \prime}$ strips

FROM THE ASSORTED BACKGROUND PRINTS:
For the star block, pick one print and cut:

- (4) $23 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 23 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares
- (1) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square

For the stripes, cut:

- (4) $13 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$ strips
- (3) $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 26^{\prime \prime}$ strips


## PIECING

Use a scant $1 / 4$＂seam allowance throughout．Press seams as noted．
Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each background print $23 /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ square．

With right sides together，place 2 matching background print squares on opposite corners of the blue print $41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ square as shown．
Stitch a scant $1 / 4$＂seam on both sides of the marked line．Cut on the marked line and press the background print triangles out．

With right sides together，place a matching background print square on the large blue print triangle as shown．
Stitch a scant $1 / 4$＂seam on both sides of the marked line as before．Cut on the marked line and press the background print triangles out to make a flying geese unit．

The blue print square and 4 background print squares will make 4 matching flying geese． Make 1 set of flying geese．Trim units to 2 ＂$\times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ．

For the star block，gather the following pieces：
－（4）matching flying geese units
－（1）matching background print $31 / 2$＂square
－（4）matching blue print 2 ＂squares

Lay out the pieces as shown．
Join the pieces to make 3 horizontal rows． Press the seams open or toward the background corner squares and the center print square． Join the rows to make a completed star block． Press seams open or toward the center row．

Trim star block to $61 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ square．

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## PIECING continued

With red print strips at the top and bottom， lay out the red print and background print $13 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$ strips，alternating colors as shown． Join the strips with a scant $1 / 4$＂seam allowance to create a stripe panel that measures roughly $65 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$ ．Press seams open．
Trim the short stripe panel to measure $6^{1 / 2 "} \times 181 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ．

Join the star block to the left side of the stripe panel．Press the seam open or toward the stripe panel．

Lay out the red print and background print $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 26^{\prime \prime}$ strips，alternating colors as shown． There will be a cream strip at the top and a red strip at the bottom．
Join the strips with a scant $1 / 4$＂seam allowance to create a stripe panel that measures roughly $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 26^{\prime \prime}$ ．Press seams open．
Trim the long stripe panel to measure $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ．

Join the long stripe panel to the star／short stripe unit as shown．Press the seam open．Trim pillow top to $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ．


## ASSEMBLY

If desired，quilt the pillow top．For quilting pillow tops，Carrie likes to use a thin cotton batting and the thinnest bleached muslin she can find for the backing．
